Happy New Year!

If any Brother Knight knows of any man in our parish who is a Catholic Gentleman, age 18 or older, then it is your opportunity to ask him to become a Knight. Remember, he can always say no, but if approached more than once, he may change his mind. We do really need new people in our Council. This is not just about filling in vacancies, but it is about giving other men the chance to practice their faith, become stronger Christians and provide their assistance in our giving of Charity to those in need. Yes, Charity does begin at home! Our home Council!

With the mention of Charity, once again we provided a check for \$125.00 to Business for Excellence or what we refer to as the Backpack Program. To reiterate, for those who either missed the item or who were not at a previous meeting when this was discussed, we had been giving \$100.00 each quarter for the Backpack Program; however, by increasing the amount to \$125.00 each quarter we will reach the goal of \$500.00 per year by which we can then request a \$100.00 refund from Supreme. This is part of the Food For Families program. It's a great deal for Backpack and a better deal for us!

Our dinner in December went quite well and we appreciate the donations made to help cover the costs. The total bill paid to Lil Sambo's was \$336.00 and our intake to pay for it was \$250.00. That is wonderful. Once again, our Charity is hard at work and the difference of \$86.00 is what was paid for the Widows' supper, once again reminding us that Fr. Michael J. McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus with the intent to protect and assist the women and children of the Knights. Well done my Brothers!

IRS Form 990 EZ—this form will be filed during January. What is it you may ask? This is an IRS form that is required to be filed by any organizations such as a non-profit church or fraternal organization (Knights of Columbus) each year. *(From the IRS website): Most small tax-exempt organizations whose annual gross receipts are normally \$50,000 or less can satisfy their annual reporting requirement by electronically submitting Form 990, Form 990-N or Form 990-EZ.* Our Council files Form 990-EZ.

As noted from the minutes of our last meeting, Brother Chuck Kosinski brought back some items for Washington D.C. and presented them to the Council to be used in a future raffle. I guess our GK Dave will have to practice his auctioneer's voice for this one!

Don't forget to send your F.S. any hours of Fraternal Service you or a family member performed during this past Calendar Year. This should be done not later than this Thursday after the monthly meeting.

We may be holding another First Degree this month. Plan to come and be a part of this wonderful event and help us welcome another candidate to become a Brother Knight!
